### 8. Executive summary/An overview

Martin Luther Christian University has undertaken a diverse array of initiatives and endeavours over the past year. This executive summary encapsulates the key activities and achievements during the year.

**Enrolment:** A total of 1,041 enrolments were recorded during the year, comprising 335 postgraduates, 253 undergraduates, 92 diploma students, 1 PG diploma student, 1 certificate, 82 Ph.D. candidates, and 277 individuals entering through lateral entry into various programs.

**New Programmes:** 8 new programmes were introduced during the academic year. The MBA in Information Technology, MBA in Hospital and Healthcare Management, MSc in Environmental Science (General), BA in Applied Linguistics, BA in English Literature, PG Diploma in Business Administration, PG Diploma in Christian Management, PG Diploma Hospital and Healthcare Management. A Certificate of Proficiency in Functional Khasi/Garo/Hindi and Certificate of Proficiency in French/ German/ Italian/ Spanish/Mandarin/ Greek/Hebrew /Japanese were also introduced.

**New appointments and resignation:** With the University continually growing, there is a need for more human resource and expertise in various fields. Towards this end, 34 new appointments were made with also 20 resignations during the year.

**Memberships and Partnerships:** The university established MoUs with Jwatbor Cajee and Associates, Prime Meghalaya, Society for Urban and Rural Empowerment (SURE), The State Resource Centre on Disability Affairs (SRCDA), The Parkinson's Disease and Movement Disorder Society, Tally Education private Ltd and Canolfan Gerdd William Mathias Music Centre in Wales. The university is a member of the National Institute of Disaster Management Ministry of Home Affairs India Universities and Institutions Network for Disaster Risk Reduction.

**New policies:** The university has introduced various policies in it various academic and administrative fuctioning such as the zero Waste Management Policy, Professor of Practice Policy, MLCU Press Publication Policy, Adverse Incident Report Policy, Policy for use of the University seal, rubber, stamps and signatures Policy, Policy on Holidays and Compensatory Days, Policy on financial support for continuous professional development, Policy on incentivizing Staff on funded Research Projects, Assessment and Evaluation Grid for UG and PG.

**Digital initiatives of the University:** The University has purchased licences for CAMU an Information Management System by Octoze Technologies Private Limited. Additionally, the university has implemented KEKA Hire, MOODLE 4.0 LMS and has also made efforts to digitize the library.

**Scholarships:** 73 students across various departments were awarded the in-house Martin Luther Christian University scholarship award. Additionally, 9 external scholarships were also awarded.

**Community engagement and outreach activities:** Various community engagement activities have been conducted during the year. To name a few, these include the Health camps at Mawsynnam, Myriaw and Lyngiong village, Team building workshop at Reach Shillong Ministries, Awareness programme on waste Management at Pyndenlitha village, Career

Orientation and Preparation, at Seven Set Higher Secondary School, Shillong and Sunny Dale Higher Secondary School, Shillong.

**Research projects:** The university received a number of externally funded projects during the year from organisations such as the Indian Council of Medical Research, State Council of Science Technology and Environment, Meghalaya and the North East Zone Cultural Centre.

## 1.15.3 Academic activities / Courses in the Department: Brief statement of academic activities of the Department

The Department of Allied Health Science was set up in 2006 with the mission statement "*To be a department of excellence, dedicated to quality education in healthcare and research by integrating values, commitment, social consciousness, professionalism and services thereby creating skilled health professionals*" and with the following objectives:

- To equip students with hands-on experience and enhance their skills in their field of study.
- To prepare them to be skill-ful and confident as they move from the classroom environment to their world of work.
- To uplift healthcare in rural and urban settings.
- To have laboratory, clinical and community engagement.

• To produce trained professionals who are locally and globally competent and to enhance their employability.

The courses offered are Diploma in Medical Laboratory Technology, Diploma in Medical Imaging Technology, Bachelor of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology, Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging Technology, Bachelor of Science in Surgical and Operation Theatre Technology, Bachelor of Science in Physician Assistant and Bachelor of Science in Optometry. The post-graduate courses include Master of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology with Specialization in Microbiology and Biochemistry and Generic, Master of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology. Bachelor of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology Generic, Master of Science in Medical Laboratory Technology.

The Department follows the model curriculum of the Ministry of Health. The clinical postings are in-house and to hospitals for hands-on exposure alongside health camps in urban and rural areas. The Under Graduate (UG) students go for a 12 months' internship and carry out a project during the period whereas Post Graduate (PG) and diploma students go for a six months' duration of internship with a dissertation (PG).



#### Schedule S: Significant Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts

#### March 31, 2023

#### A. Significant Accounting Policies:

#### 1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and all significant items of income and expenditure are accounted on the accrual basis of accounting. The Statements of Accounts comply with generally accepted accounting policies and mandatory accounting standards and statements issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

#### 2. Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the University to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent liabilities at the dates of the financial statements, and the results of operations during the reported period. Although these estimates are based on the University's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and the estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known or materialized.

#### 3. Income Recognition

All income including tuition and other fees are recognized on their due dates on accrual basis. The portion of fees received which pertains to the subsequent financial year are treated as fees received in advance.

#### 4. Expenses

All expenses are accounted on accrual basis and provisions are made for all known liabilities.

5. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at their cost of acquisition inclusive of freight, duties, taxes and incidental expenses relating to acquisition of the asset, and the cost of installation/erection as applicable.

#### 6. Depreciation

Depreciation is charged on cost as per written down value method as per rates given in Rule 5, Appendix I of the Income-tax Rules, 1962 Leasehold improvements are amortized over the period of the lease and computer software has been depreciated  $(\hat{a} + 40\%)$ .

#### 7. Impairment of Assets

Impairment of an asset would take place when the carrying value of the asset exceeds its recoverable amount. Accordingly, impairment losses will be charged to the Income & Expenditure Account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognized in a previous accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of the recoverable amount.

#### 8. Provisions

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Provisions that are not otherwise made in the accounts are disclosed by way of appropriate note, wherever applicable.

#### 9. Contingent Liabilities & Contingent Assets

Contingent liabilities are not recognized, but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

#### B. Notes on Accounts:

- 1. Fixed assets include building in progress and expenses incurred towards land development.
- 2. Depreciation has been charged on the written down value of assets as per rates given in Rule 5. Appendix 1 of the Income-tax Rules, 1962 and computation of depreciation on additions during the year has been made from the date on which the assets have been effectively put to use. Leasehold improvements have been amortized over the period of lease.
- Interest carned on investment of university endowment fund has been allocated between the Development Fund and Endowment Fund in accordance with Section 40(4) of the Martin Luther Christian University Act, 2005. Interest earned on investment of other endowment funds is apportioned among the respective funds.
- 4. By an arrangement with KJPA, the University paid the equated monthly installments (EMI) of the loan availed by KJPA from IDBI Bank for the construction of additional floors of the KJPA Conference Centre which is being used for library and classrooms. A contingent liability exists in this behalf with respect to a rental charge for the premises or partial/full amortization of the EMI.
- 5. The University undertakes execution of projects and carries out consulting engagements on behalf of government agencies and non-governmental organizations as part of its initiatives to build practical knowledge for its faculty and students. The receipts and disbursements in respect of projects and consulting engagements completed during the year are stated in the Income & Expenditure Statement and the remaining ones are carried over under Designated Fund Accounts in the Balance Sheet.

- As per the current year there is no provision made for doubtful debts as there is enough provision made in the previous year.
- There are outstanding amounts as raised by the Income Tax Department for the AY 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2018-19 for which an appeal/ rectification has been filed with the Income Tax Department and have been contested against the same.
- 8. Previous year figures have been regrouped and re-arranged wherever necessary.

# Martin Luther Christian University Report of the 15<sup>th</sup> Convocation



The 15<sup>th</sup> Convocation of the Martin Luther Christian University was held on September 29, 2022, at Windermere Resorts, Umpling. Mr. Charles Pyngrope, a Member of, the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly graced the occasion as the Chief Guest, and Mr. Stan Thekaekara, founder, Action for Community Organisation Rehabilitation and Development (ACCORD), Gudalur delivered the convocation address. Of the total 708 graduating students, 12 PhDs, 5 MPhils, 368 master's degrees, 223 bachelor's degrees, 11 postgraduate diplomas, and 86 diplomas, 3 certificate courses were awarded. The university also awarded the Honorary Doctorate to Mr. Carmo Noronha, Executive Director, of Bethany Society for his pioneering work in mainstreaming disability through advocacy.

While congratulating the graduates of 2022, Mr. Pyngrope in his address reminisced on the time when he was a member of the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly and the Bill for the MLCU Act was introduced and he voted in the affirmative. He further added, "16 years later I stand here and congratulate the university and the management for its strife in its endeavor towards educating the youth of the region." He further went on to stress that literacy is a means to development but many educational institutions are producing non-performing human assets. He emphasized that educational institutions must be reminded that the great destiny of mankind will only be achieved through the strengthening of the mind of the youth, hence we should urgently realign the education system with the foremost values of our civilization.

In his convocation address, Mr Thekaekara spoke at length on the importance of tribal ethics and way of life. He said that people are created equal but in reality, that is hardly ever true, we all see equality as desirable but it has led us to believe that egalitarianism is a pipe dream. But in tribal communities, egalitarianism happens by design. He further added that it is applaudable that tribal communities hardly have any segregation between the different socio-economic groups. He concluded that tribals are smart enough to realize that God resides in nature and that God can be found not in ornate buildings but in what he created.

# Report of the University presented by Dr. T.K Bamon, Vice Chancellor at the 15<sup>th</sup> Convocation of Martin Luther Christian University: September 29, 2022

We are honored to have the privilege of briefly presenting to you the summary of the Progress Report of the University for the academic session 2021-22.

## General

- 1. **Introduction and recognitions**: Since its establishment in 2006 as a State Private University, and as we enter into our 17<sup>th</sup> academic year with our 15<sup>th</sup> Convocation, Martin Luther Christian University has much to rejoice for.
- 2. Education World- Martin Luther Christian University (MLCU), Shillong was ranked 52 in the top hundred private universities in the country and the number one private multidisciplinary university in Meghalaya.
- 3. Enrollment: Total new enrollment as of September 11, 2022, is 908.

#### **Academic Highlights**

The university has been growing in strength with 72 full-time teaching staff, 58 non-teaching staff, and 18 adjunct faculty. The departments and centers have been robust in bringing about positive developments in line with the academic policies of the university. The university presently has four schools, 18 departments, and 3 centers. For the current Academic year, the University offers 7 Diploma programs, 16 Undergraduate programs, and 27 postgraduate programs. The University also offers Ph.D. programs for secular and theological studies.

Experiential learning is the core of our teaching and learning pedagogy. MLCU is fortunate to have the support of numerous organizations and institutions. These partners offer experiential learning to our students, professional expertise for our faculty, and collaborations for community and research projects.

The University endorses the National Education Policy 2020. Many emerging academic trends, policies, and pedagogy have been incorporated into the curriculum such as interdisciplinary Sustainable Development Goals Subject, Basic COVID knowledge, and skills online courses, Blended Learning, and internships. On April 20-23, 2022 the Academic Retreat was organized for all faculty to reflect on the current MLCU academic philosophies, policies, and practices and to apprise and discuss the National Education Policy 2020 and its implications.

MLCU also renewed its collaboration with Martin Luther University College, Waterloo, Canada. This collaboration will mutually share the resources for building closer cooperation and partnership between the Faculty of Theology and Religious Studies, MLCU, Shillong, and Martin Luther University College in Waterloo, Canada.

#### **Research highlights**

Research is the core of a university. Research in terms of doctoral programs, funded research, and publication are all being taken care of by the Department of Doctoral Studies and Research. With time, the department has seen an increase in the number of enrolment of scholars in the doctoral programs that are being offered, in the number of funded projects being awarded, and in publications by the University as well. We may be reminded that the lockdown imposed due COVID 19 infection has affected the pace of research, yet it never stopped the researchers from being innovative and finding different ways to cope with the situation. The sheer number of PhDs being awarded in this convocation is bearing testimony to that. Some of the research proposals that were written and prepared during the lockdown period have seen the light of day in 2021. To name a few, a 3.5 crore project was awarded by DST (Department of Science and Technology) last year, an IICMR-funded project amounting to 37 Lacs was awarded this year, and others. The publication section came up with a free online course entitled *An Introduction to Covid-19 an Informed Citizen and Community Volunteer* which was prepared and compiled during the lockdown period.

To strengthen the processes of the department several policies have been drawn, this includes policies on Interdisciplinary Approaches to Doctoral Research, Gender Sensitive Research, Culture in Research, and Teaching Assistantships for Ph.D. Scholars, to name a few. To support the CPD of the faculty members in the University, the department has also updated its policies on Financial Support for Faculty and Staff Development, Journal Standards for Article Submission, Progress and Support for Faculty Publications, and Screening and Support for Faculty Publications. The department has been able to conduct workshops on research methods, academic writing, SPSS, and others for both the scholars and faculty members

#### Student support and services

The office of the Dean of Students is an important part of the University's administration. It primarily focuses on the overall development, comprehensive as well as the enhancements of core values among students. Student support and services have been an integral part of deliverance. Besides supporting the academics of the students, the Dean Students' office pushes and motivates the students to explore their hidden

talents and various areas of interest, be it sports, arts, cultural performing art, or any other facet of innovation they are interested in.

The office undertakes various student schemes and activities throughout the year inclusively and holistically, the aim is to provide logistic support to the students to bring out the best in them, be it in academics or any other field.

#### Students' Growth and fulfilments: Student Council and NSS

With the help of NSS and the Student Council, the office has been able to conduct many events at the University throughout the year. The Dean Students' office also takes part in several social programs promoted by Govt. of India and the State Govt. like Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, Yoga Month, among others. The office of Dean Students' is committed to helping promote and assisting in all programs. Currently, the following are the number of members in NSS, Rangers, and Rovers

NSS members: 330 Rangers and Rovers members: 35

#### Alumni Association

The Alumni Association has been registered with the government. Currently, there are 342 registered members.

#### **Financial Aid: Scholarship**

In 2021, a Free COVID Scholarship of 100 seats has been initiated for students belonging to the loweconomic background, who were affected by COVID directly or indirectly.

In 2022, the MLCU Scholarship Awards of 100 seats were offered to students belonging to different communities and children who are facing economic hardship and cannot afford the cost of education.

#### **Campus Health Plan: Centre for Counselling**

The Campus Health Plan' was initiated in 2021 and focuses on providing students and staff with enriching well-being by providing facilities and resources. Within the plan, an infirmary under the supervision of the department of AHS is formulated to act as a first aid station for emergencies on any physical health issues.

Besides counseling services, the center focuses on providing mental remedies through various strategies such as:

- 1. Mental Health Awareness Programme World Suicide Prevention Day, World Mental Health Day, and so on
- 2. Helping-Skills Enhancement Programme This program aims to equip individuals within the campus with basic soft skills to enhance their natural helping style.
- **3.** Mental Gym Conducting relevant workshops that would offer skills that help them keep mentally fit as well as allow them to develop practices on how to handle stressors and also prevent them from stressors.

- 4. **The Student Profile -** From the student data, one could then develop a *student risk assessment profile* for mental health, when we include their demographic profile.
- 5. **Mentorship Network -** Developing a quick report guide for cases of emergencies and a brief overall semester report format so that we can track their mental health per semester.
- 6. **Collaboration with Teacher-Learning workshops -** To develop practices that foster healthy mental health preventive skills and helping skills for both students and staff.
- 7. **Student Clubs -** An open informal space where students can come together for a productive cause. We currently have nine clubs and the total number of registered members is 180. These clubs include:
  - a. Music Club
  - b. Media Club
  - c. Art/visual Club
  - d. Adventure Club
  - e. Food Club
  - f. Sports Club
  - g. Dance Club
  - h. Fashion Club
  - i. Culture Club
  - j. Comfort Club

#### Administration

- 1. Administration: The University has several statutory committees and governing bodies that meet at least twice a year. These include the Board of Governors, The Board of Management, and the Finance Committee.
- 2. University Land and Campus development:

*MLCU Umphyrnai Campus-* Umphyrnai is about 20 km from Shillong (DC's Office) off the NH 6. The New Campus Development Plan has been prepared and construction activities for infrastructural development are envisaged to be implemented in two phases.

On approval of the Preamble for the Campus by the Board of Governors held on March 2, 2021, an Expression of Interest for a Campus Master Plan Design Concept for the New Propose MLCU Campus at Umphyrnai was released through local dailies on July 5, 2021. The architectural firm that was selected out of the 14 firms that participated in the EoI, is in the process of finalizing the DPR which will contain the structural, architectural designs, and drawings including landscaping and other building project work.

The approach to the architectural design of the campus is culturally and aesthetically oriented landscape integration that allows the layout of the campus to blend with the natural surroundings and the habitations around the MLCU campus. The MLCU Umphyrnai Campus would represent a cluster of communities (educational and traditional), with a setting that includes the community within and around the campus to be involved in interdisciplinary and intergenerational discourse.

The architectural structure of the administrative section and each department /school/faculty though modern could reflect the tribal architecture of the northeast, each, with a story of heritage. However, the design would also incorporate the infrastructural needs of each department /school/faculty.

The ambience of learning will extend beyond the formal classroom, a sense of learning that comes from nature and neighbouring communities. Beyond the formal learning classrooms, spaces where faculty, students, and visitors to the university share an experience, are not only didactic, it also hands-on for example, in the making of arts and crafts, such as pottery, cane, and bamboo work, painting, sports such as archery music and the other fine arts.

The library would particularly hold documents about the life and work of MLCU and that of known and unknown contributors from all walks of life in northeast India. Living museums would showcase paintings, artefacts, and crafts of the tribal people in multimedia formats. There would be spaces for gatherings, formal and informal for discourses, storytelling, music, dance, drama, celebrations, feasts, and mourning, for old and young alike.

The green campus would have kitchen gardens, botanical gardens, a medicinal plant park, a sacred forest, and jogging and trekking trails. The campus would aspire to be self-sustainable and resourceful in terms of energy, water, and recycling.

The building design and structures are inspired by the folklore about the origin of the Khasi Pnar community from Mystical Heaven where the 7 (Seven) Trep (Huts) and 9 (Nine) Basa (Hut-like structures).

The 9 (Nine) Basa is represented by the "Khoh" Conical structure to one side having 9(Nine) Segments of a Structural grid. The 7 (Seven) Trep is represented by the "Knup" elliptical structure 7(Seven) in numbers. The Golden Tree is represented by the common passageways connecting the 9 (Nine) Basa and the 7 (Seven) Trep.

In this endeavour, the Campus Development Office of the University plans for a ground-breaking ceremony and commencement of construction work for the New MLCU Campus at Umphyrnai soon and expects completion of the first phase by 2024.

*MLCU Umsawli Campus-* The MLCU building having a total floor area of 30,850 sq. ft located at its Umsawli Campus in New Shillong Township, is under development and currently houses the recently inaugurated Science Technology and Innovation Hub and two other departments. Upon Completion of the remaining floors of the building, this campus will provide facilities for teaching-learning, with a barrier-free environment, facilities to support research, an ecosystem for innovation, facilities for the creation and transfer of knowledge, green campus initiatives, and general campus facilities.

- 3. **Staff Welfare-**The university has introduced a Group Health Insurance Policy for all teaching and Non-Teaching staff of the university.
- 4. **Library-** The main library of Martin Luther Christian University, is called the Dr. Homiwell Library, which has been named after the late Dr. Homiwell Lyngdoh (1877-1958). Currently, the Library has a collection of 7690 books and 63 PhD thesis.
